Main Stage

Set against the backdrop of Perth’s industrial history, the repurposed East Perth Power Station stands as a striking fusion of past and future.

Once a towering symbol of raw energy, this sprawling structure now pulses with an entirely different kind of power – the electric beats of cutting-edge electronica and live music.

Inspired by iconic venues like London’s Printworks, the space retains its industrial grit, with steel beams and a cavernous dancefloor. Neon lighting and high-tech visuals carve pathways through the crowd. The Power Station melds industrial decay with a vibrant, dynamic edge – a haven for those chasing the intersection of sound, light, history and music.

Electric Fields

Mesmerising electronic dance duo Electric Fields bring their high-octane dancefloor sound to get this Festival started right.

Renowned for their captivating fusion of vibrant traditional culture with soulful pop and electronica, Electric Fields’ evocative story-songs are breathtaking. And they’ll have you up on your feet from the first note.

You’ve seen them on the Eurovision stage, now experience the brilliance of Electric Fields on our Main Stage. This huge opening celebration also stars visionary Noongar electro-pop beat creator Boox Kid and more special guests.

Expect a turbo-charged set that drives from house to synth-pop and back again. Ibibio Sound Machine are a kaleidoscopic mash-up of African and electronic elements. Inspired by the golden era of West-African funk and disco, and modern post-punk and electro, this electrifying group of musicians and their sexy, synth-driven soundscape bring a ‘90s retro-futurist vibe that is engulfing club circles right now.

Charismatic Nigerian singer and frontwoman Eno Williams’ otherworldly voice and PK Ambrose’s throbbing bass drive through a captivating array of house, post-punk, funk, afrobeat and disco, with equal parts bangers and ballads to unite the dancefloor.

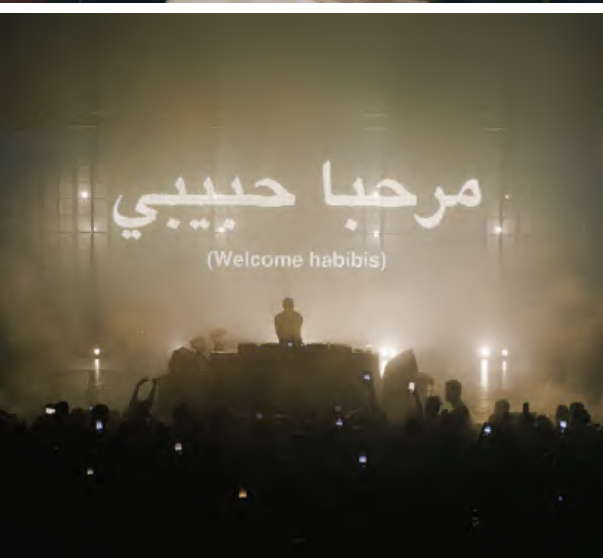

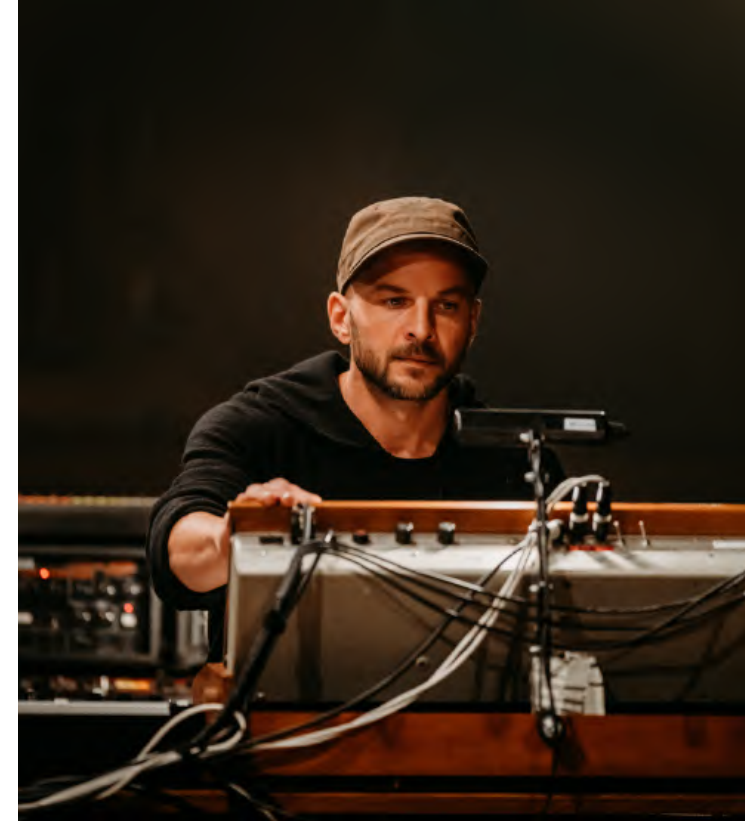

Shaped by a group of First Nations curators and arts leaders, Boorloo Contemporary is a commissioning and development stream fostering genre-defying, cutting-edge artworks that connect with tradition and anticipate the future. Discover transformative, immersive experiences from artists who are facilitating the most important conversations of our time.

Launching Boorloo Contemporary is an illuminated commission for East Perth Power Station. New work by Noongar artists Allan Yarran, Ilona McGuire and Daniel Hansen visually speak to the history of the site

in colour, record and poem. A provocative 'nose-to-tail' west Kimberley feast and ambitious solo exhibitions from Alice Guinness and Mervyn Street also feature in the inaugural Boorloo Contemporary program at different locations across Perth.

Alice Guinness

Burndud Ground

Share in the rich Yindjibarndi culture in this major new commission.

Elder and senior artist Alice Guinness holds a deep connection with the Burndud, an important site and story for the Yindjibarndi people. Each stroke of the Burndud circle tells a story and it is through her special connection that Alice – who lives with a disability that limits her speaking – shares herself with the world.

Alice’s Burndud paintings have become iconic across the Pilbara. Her use of bold colour and patterns embody the rhythms and movement of the women dancing and the men singing in Ceremony. Now these works will be celebrated and shared with Festival audiences, brought to life in neon sculpture and immersive media installations. See, hear and feel Yindjibarndi Ngurra through vibrations of light and sound that teach the Burndud song cycle of birds, animals, plants, hills, water places, the stars and the moon.

With his vivid memory and natural talent for capturing movement and colour, Mervyn shares his life, Country and history of his family in paintings, drawings, carvings and animations that reveal love, struggle and triumph. *Stolen Wages* features newly commissioned paintings that continue Mervyn’s legacy of telling truth to power, following his historic court victory over the State Government for decades of wages stolen from the station workers of the Kimberley.

A west Kimberley Saltwater story. Over dinner.

Take your seat at an opulent long table set with custom designs by regional WA artists. Surrounded by a monumental video installation you'll be immersed in a unique dining experience.

As you enjoy your meal, the whole journey of the 'killa' – Kimberley cattle taken straight from the bush and shared amongst families – comes to life, inviting you to share in cultural narratives and life experiences from the west Kimberley coast. Whilst the filmed preparation of the animal unfolds in the projections around you, eight very special dishes, prepared by head chef of the Double Rainbow kitchen, tell the story of Aboriginal food cultures and how introduced species have become part of the Kimberley diet.

A 'nose to tail' dining event co-created with a team from the Kimberley, *Killa: Pindan to Plate* is a literal visual feast. Savour select saltwater treats and honey-driven desserts alongside smokey pindan-inspired beef served multiple ways.

Walk with us as we pull back the curtain to a lifestyle that is conscious of food sustainability and eating practices that exist alongside living on Country.

Flesh out the social, economic and cultural context of food and life – and put your money where your mouth is.

Why Not Theatre

Mahabharata

An epic tale you've waited 4,000 years to hear.

East meets West meets Perth. Old meets new. Poetry meets performance. A classic story of rivalry and humanity shared in Indian households around the world.

Mahabharata takes an ancient Sanskrit poem about dynasties vying for control of a kingdom and turns it into a once-in-a-generation theatrical experience. Meet the Pandavas and the Kauravas – two royal families fighting for control of the kingdom their grandfather once ruled. It's a tale as old as Homer's *Odyssey* or as recent as TV's *Succession*.

Led by an international South Asian cast, *Mahabharata* takes you on a journey featuring gods, the supernatural and the urge to seek bloody vengeance. It's all brought to life by a hypnotic live soundtrack of classical Indian music and dance, woven together by the ultimate storyteller.

In June 2017 Air Force linguist Reality Winner is surprised at her home by armed FBI agents. They're investigating a leak. Classified information has got out about Russian hacking to influence the 2016 US presidential election. Reality lets the agents in. They chat. Gradually, it becomes clear: this is an interrogation.

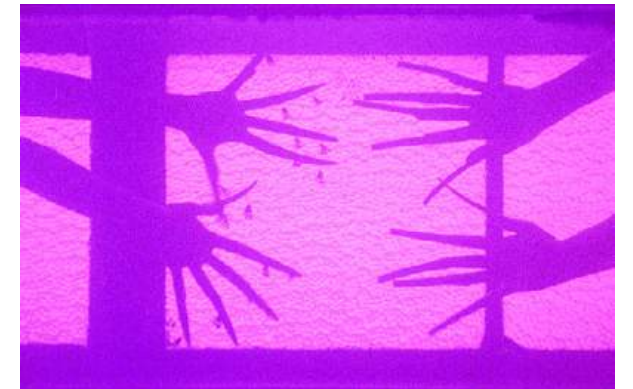

Perth Festival is just one arm of the University that continues to make remarkable and life-changing contributions across learning, teaching and research, to advance the intellectual, cultural and economic development of Western Australia, the nation and our world.

The University continues to forge connections with the community, partners and industry to ensure its impact is far-reaching, now and into the future.

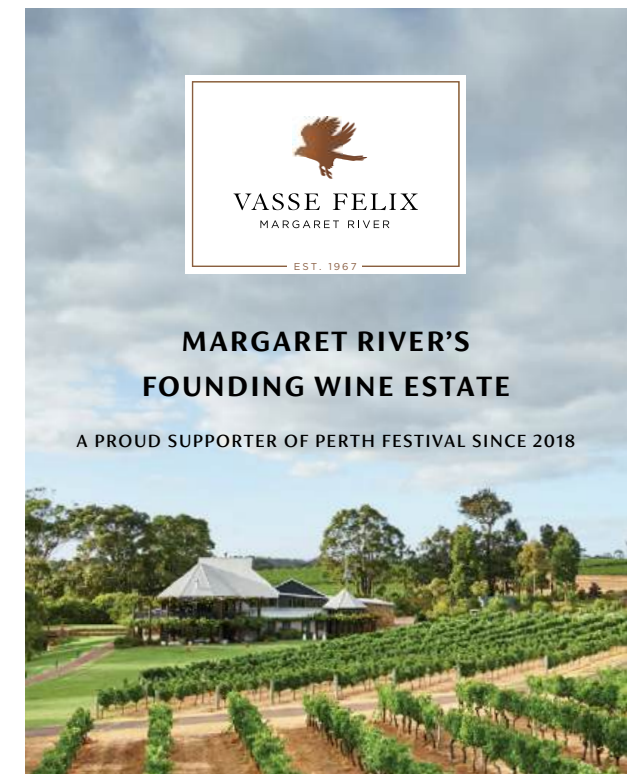
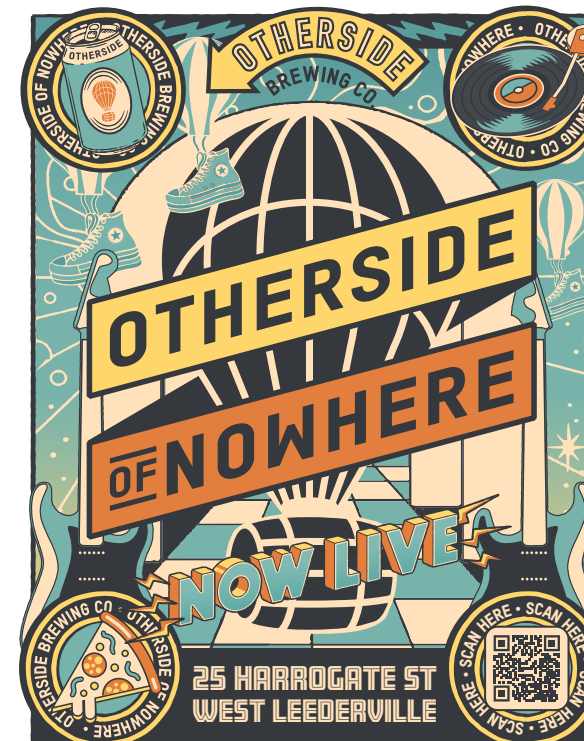
