

FAQs The BhuMeJha Project

1. What is The BhuMeJha Project?

The BhuMeJha Project is an immersive evening of ceremony, culture, song, dance, storytelling, and ritual. It explores the deep connection between the ancient cultures of Gondwanaland, bringing together artists and elders from Arnhem Land, Noongar Boodjar, India, and Malaysia. More than a performance, it is a shared experience of reflection, harmony, and connection.

2. Where is the event taking place?

The event will be held at The Art Sanctuary in the Perth Hills, a tranquil space of healing, peace, and creativity. Directions and parking details will be included in your event reminder email.

3. What time should I arrive?

Gates open at 5:00pm for your arrival and exploration of the site. We recommend arriving no later than 6:00pm to enjoy the full experience.

4. What is the schedule for the evening?

5:00pm – Exploration, workshops & demonstrations

6:30pm – Move to the performance space

6:45pm – Performance begins

7:45pm – Performance concludes, followed by shared food and conversation

8:30pm – Event concludes

5. What can I expect during the experience?

Guests are invited to wander through the grounds, taking in the natural setting before gathering for a live performance of music, dance, and storytelling. The evening concludes with a communal sharing of food and conversation, a time to connect and reflect on the themes of the experience.

6. Will food and drink be provided?

Yes. A light vegetarian food offering will be shared after the performance, as part of the evening's gathering. Water will be available on site; we encourage guests to bring a refillable bottle.

7. What happens if I have dietary requirements?

All food will be vegetarian; and additional dietary requirements will be catered for onsite.

8. Is the event outdoors?

Yes. The BhuMeJha Project takes place outdoors in the beautiful natural surroundings of The Art Sanctuary. Please dress for the weather and environment and wear comfortable footwear suitable for uneven ground.

9. What should I wear?

Please wear comfortable clothing and footwear, a warm layer for the evening as temperatures may drop after sunset.

10. Where should I park?

There is very limited paid event parking available adjacent to the venue. Parking can be purchased with your ticket in advance.

11. Is there public transport to the Art Sanctuary?

Yes. A free event shuttle will run between Kelmscott Train Station and The Art Sanctuary. Additional free parking is available near Kelmscott Train Station for those connecting via shuttle.

12. Is the event accessible for wheelchair users?

The site includes natural terrain and uneven surfaces. If you are a wheelchair user or have mobility or access requirements, please contact us in advance so we can support your experience.

13. Is this suitable for children and families?

The event is suitable for all ages.

14. Are chairs supplied?

Yes, a selection of chairs will be available for guests as well as floor seating.

15. Can I bring my own chair to sit on?

Yes, you are welcome to bring your own picnic rugs, low chairs or folding seats.
